. Do I Need Travel Insurance?

My Comment: Thankfully, our inquiry volume has increased in the last couple of months. Virtually every caller is asking about travel insurance. Basically, it's an excellent idea to buy travel insurance! The peace of mind alone is worth it. As luck would have it, this article appeared in the WSJ this past Monday and I am including excerpts in case you didn't see it.

From the WSJ: Even the most freewheeling traveler frets about planning a trip in the Covid era. We ask travel experts for their advice on picking the best plan. Travel insurance will only cover you so far.

CONTEMPLATING A VACATION in the era of Covid inevitably involves a slew of "what ifs" that could force you to cancel and potentially lose the money you put down. Most travel experts recommend insuring any trip that costs more than a few thousand dollars. From there, it gets complicated. Policies range from simple "check the box" protection that airlines push at checkout to comprehensive plans that cover all manner of mishaps, like a ski accident or an airline shutting down. Industry officials say the majority of claims filed under these policies are for trip cancellation, typically when the traveler or an immediate family member gets sick or injured before the trip. Premiums range from 5% to 10% of the total trip tab.

Who should buy travel insurance?

"It's not for everyone," said attorney Jeffrey Miller, a travel law expert at Florida Atlantic University. "A 25-year-old going to Las Vegas doesn't need travel insurance," he said. A 55-year-old with an ailing parent back home should consider it for a trip like a cruise, which requires a hefty deposit upfront. Among the factors affecting price and coverage, he said, are a traveler's age, the type and length of the trip and even where the person lives, since these policies, like other forms of insurance, are regulated by individual states. Some airlines have continued to waive change fees to make rebooking easier. But anyone making deposits in advance for big-ticket items like a safari or a cruise faces steep cancellation penalties as they get closer to departure. "Suppliers are weary of making exceptions," said Gwen Kozlowski, president of Exeter International, a luxury tour operator.

If Covid disrupts my trip, will the insurance policy cover my expenses?

To an extent. "If you get Covid before traveling, you're generally covered if you have to postpone or cancel," said Ms. Kozlowski. But a typical plan will rarely cover cancellation if a country closes its borders, or the State Department issues an advisory for your

destination. If you test positive for the coronavirus while traveling, a trip delay clause may cover some expenses you rack up waiting for the all-clear to return home—typically up to \$200 a day. Simply citing fear of catching the virus won't get you off the hook, unless you buy a much more expensive "Cancel for Any Reason" (CFAR) policy. These plans, as they're known, can cost 40% to 60% more than basic insurance, and the coverage often pays out only 50% to 75% of your total expenses, compared with the full cost paid by regular policies.

Coincidentally, on Valentine's Day I got the call from Dr. Shattner's Nurse at the MSKCC who stated that "there was no cancer present." Woohoo!! Better than roses. However, I need to have a follow up examination and another biopsy before the end of the year to see if anything has changed. Looks like I'll be in Stuttgart in May 😊. I am also grateful to Dr. Richard Bender, MD, (another Fast Lane Alumni) who wrote the chapters on pancreatic cancer in the medical books at Harvard and other renowned schools, for his follow-up, advice, counsel, and support.

While in NYC my older daughter Alicia made sure that I stay with her and Lukas, my 8-year-old grandson. Lukas and I had an awesome time with thousands of LEGO pieces to remind me what's important in life. My younger daughter, Julie, shuttled me to and from my appointments and supervised all interactions with the physicians at MSKCC – I was superbly taken care of. Finally, I want to thank each and everyone of you for your concern, messages, encouragement, and affection – I'll be back with my "True Stories" on your next trip. Which reminds me – you need to start signing up especially for the US trips because the hotels will sell out quickly in the Carolinas and on the Romantic Wild West. Thank you very much!!
