Subject: The last couple of days of the Twelve Alpine Passes

I. Germany, Austria, Switzerland & Italy here we come:

A. Saturday, June 4th Austria to Italy

– This morning we left the awesome, should be a 6-Star Hotel, Interalpen in Tirol. Getting to the Interalpen, high above Innsbruck Is actually the pass that gets you to Seefeld and Mitterwald. The view on the way down is breathtaking because you can see the whole Inn Valley and the Italian Alps. We drove onto the Austrian Autobahn going West towards Bregenz and then got off in about 20 minutes to head south into the Ötztal Valley passing through Sölden, a renowned Tirolian



Ski Resort, to the challenging Timmelsjoch Pass. Of course, our man in Stuttgart, Johny, purchased the "Vignettes" Austrian Autobahn Toll Decals and affixed them in the upper left-hand corner of everyone's windshield. We then climbed up the serpentine **8,117 ft. Timmelsjoch Pass.** — I paid the €17 Toll for each car and lined up the PORSCHES on the peak. There is a motorcycle museum in the peak building — but we wanted to get going into Italy. We then crossed the **6,870 ft. Jaufen Pass**. Everyone enjoyed it so much — we went back up and did it twice, We then arrived at our beautiful 5-Star Chalet


Mirabelle overlooking the Meran Valley in Südtirol, Italy. We started with a much-deserved prosecco and canapés party on the terrace. What an awesome view. The cuisine was Michelin Star.

B. Sunday, June 5th – After a lavish breakfast, we departed this beautiful place, for St. Moritz, Switzerland. Now that everyone is used to driving the mountain roads we have planned to cross over four passes today: First, we stopped for a light lunch at our favorite restaurant in Stelvio, the Franzenshöhe on the way to the legendary 9,045 ft. Passo dello Stelvio. After Stelvio (Stilvser Joch in German) we crossed the 7,516 ft. Passo Foscagno. The 7,595 ft. Passo Livigno, and we arrived at the base of the 7,638 ft. Passo del Bernna. We were greeted by a barrier informing all traffic the pass is closed today for some serious road repair after a massive rock avalanche wiped




our part of the pass. So, instead we drove around the mountain.

- C. Monday, June 6th - Today was a 2-pass day: the 7.493 ft. Julier Pass followed by the Oberalb Pass where we had a Swiss Capuns lunch on top of the pass. We then had an exhilarating drive on the 4,140 ft. **Engelberg Pass** to the 5-Star Kempinski in Engelberg. This new hotel is spectacular, the cuisine was awesome, and the town has the Aspen feeling.
- Tuesday, June 7th A pass D. "loop" day was in store for us with the 7.969 ft. Furka Pass. the **7,100 ft. Grimsel Pass** and the 7,415 ft. Susten Pass. We had to skip the last one because we were notified of an accident on the pass and huge back up. Our farewell to Switzerland Party was delightful at the Kempinski tonight.
- Wednesday, June 8th We E. headed back to Stuttgart with a

A final 12 Alpine Passes comment. While sitting and our pre-departure dinner, I received a call from a couple cancelling their Tuscany trip because of COVID in Germany, Let me say it one more time. In Europe things are back to normal. There are testing stations on every corner. Restaurant staff is wearing masks. Walking around, dining, visiting the PORSCHE Factory or Museum there is zero concern nor requirement. People in general have become more cognizant – like keeping 6' distance in a line, voluntarily wearing a mask and washing hands frequently – stuff we're supposed to do anyway. VI. My Final Thoughts: Introducing the new Bio-Optic Organized Knowledge device, tradenamed BOOK (This is for your grandkids):

BOOK is a revolutionary breakthrough in technology: no wires, no electric circuits, no batteries, nothing to be connected or switched on. It's so easy to use, even a child can operate it.

Compact and portable, it can be used anywhere -- even sitting in an armchair by the fire -- yet it is powerful enough to hold as much information as a CD-ROM disc.

Here's how it works:

BOOK is constructed of sequentially numbered sheets of paper (recyclable), each capable of holding thousands of bits of information. The pages are locked together with a custom-fit device called a binder which keeps the sheets in their correct sequence!

Opaque Paper Technology (OPT) allows manufacturers to use both sides of the sheet, doubling the information density and cutting costs. Experts are divided on the prospects for further increases in information density; for now, BOOKS with more information simply use more pages. Each sheet is scanned optically, registering information directly into your brain. A flick of the finger takes you to the next sheet.

BOOK may be taken up at any time and used merely by opening it. BOOK ever crashes or requires rebooting, though, like other devices, it can become damaged if coffee is spilled on it and it becomes unusable if dropped too many times on a hard surface. The "browse" feature allows you to move instantly to any sheet, and move forward or backward as you wish. Many come with an "index" feature, which pin-points the exact location of any selected information for instant retrieval.

An optional "BOOKmark" accessory allows you to open BOOK to the exact place you left it in a previous session -- even if the BOOK has been closed. BOOKmarks fit universal design standards; thus, a single BOOKmark can be used in BOOKs by various manufacturers. Conversely, numerous BOOKmarkers can be used in a single BOOK if the user wants to store numerous views at once. The number is limited only by the number of pages in the BOOK. You can also make personal notes next to BOOK text entries with optional programming tools, Portable Erasable Nib Cryptic Intercommunication Language Styli (PENCILS).

Portable, durable, and affordable, BOOK is being hailed as a precursor of a new entertainment wave. BOOK's appeal seems so certain that thousands of content creators have committed to the platform and investors are reportedly flocking to invest. Look for a flood of new titles soon.
