I. Julie Sonenberg's Guest Post. Readers of the Petergram know that my dad, Peter, has an acute skill for planning a scintillating itinerary. My family had the opportunity to benefit from this talent when he planned an "Opa's Austria" vacation for our family: my husband David, my daughter Billie, my sister Alicia, and her son Lukas.

As you know, my father hails from war-torn Austria and had a very difficult childhood which involved hunger, illness, poverty, and turmoil. He made the incredibly brave decision to come to the United States alone when he was 17 years old – to start a new life. Through grit and sheer determination, he has had a very successful career and, if I may say so, raised a lovely family.

Our trip started in Vienna where we stayed at the Hotel Europa where my father was "discovered" by an American businessman who told him "You seem like the type of person who would do well in America." The generosity by the Vaughan family who sponsored my father to come to America in 1962 has been paid forward exponentially by all the people whose lives my dad has touched, who have befriended and whom he mentored and supported in the course of his life.

My dad carefully considered which activities the children would enjoy when planning our trip, accounting for jet lag and early dinner times. in Vienna, we saw St. Stephen's Cathedral, Schönbrunn Palace, the Medieval Kreuzenstein Fortress, and had the opportunity for shopping as well as the spectacular view from the Donauturm. We also got to take a tour around the city in a convertible antique electric car as well as a visit to the Prater (the Viennese amusement park, a highlight for the kids!).



We drove through the mountains to Mürzzuschlag where my dad's grandparents lived. We stopped on the way in Semmering, a mountain village where my dad and his mother worked during the post-war Russian Occupation, at the resort Hotel Panhans in the summertime. Mürzzuschlag is a small village with gorgeous landscape views. We walked in the forest where my dad used to go berry and mushroom

picking with his grandfather and visited a magical forest which was a favorite for the children.

To break up the drive to Salzburg, we stopped in Erzberg to have the very unique experience of a tour of an iron ore strip mine in a huge monstrous mining truck. In Salzburg, we enjoyed the beautiful views from our terrace at the Sheraton Grand Hotel; shopping on the Getreidegasse; and we had the opportunity to visit the international language school where Alicia and I spent two summers thirty years ago learning German, i.e., Austrian.

In each city, dad had arranged for a dear friend to be our special guide. Hans in Vienna, Paul on the Donauturm, Gerald in Mürzzuschlag and Richard in Salzburg. All a testament to the kindness my dad spreads wherever he goes. Of course, there were history lessons galore as well as several of his famous "true stories."

Thank you, dad, for your generosity as well as the care and love you put into planning the trip of a lifetime! We love you and are so grateful we had the privilege to take this trip with you! Five Stars all the way: Highly Recommended!

- Polio was still a crippler.
- You came of age in the '50s and '60s.
- You are the last generation to experience an interlude when there were no threats to our homeland.
- The second world war was over, and the cold war, terrorism, global warming and perpetual economic insecurity had yet to haunt life with unease.
- Only your generation can remember both a time of great war and a time when our world was secure and full of bright promise and plenty.
- You grew up at the best possible time, a time when the world was getting better...
- You are "The Last Ones."
- More than 99% of you are retired, and you feel privileged to have "lived in the best of times!"
