## I. United Airlines Puts Down Deposit on Flying Taxis

United made \$10 million in predelivery payments for 100 of the aircraft being developed by Archer Aviation

United Airlines Holdings Inc. has paid a \$10 million deposit for 100 electric flying taxis, a sign that the airline is growing more confident in the nascent technology. United and a regional airline it partnered with last year, invested in and struck a preliminary agreement to buy up to 200 of the flying taxis that the San Francisco Bay Area-based company is developing. Other airlines and leasing companies have announced their own investments in flying-taxi startups and preliminary orders. But the aircraft haven't yet been approved by regulators to fly passengers, and customers generally haven't had to put down cash. The aircraft being developed by Archer and its rivals take off and land vertically like helicopters. Airlines hope that they will be able to zip customers around cities, whisking them over congested highways to and from hub airports while reducing carbon emissions for such journeys. Archer Aviation indicated that the flying taxi has a top speed of 150 mph and a range of 60 miles.

Electric-flying-taxi companies have been developing and testing vehicles but need to secure approval from regulators before they or customers that purchase the aircraft launch commercial service. In the U.S., the Federal Aviation Administration has been examining aircraft, working on pilot requirements, and looking into how to integrate



planned vehicles into the airspace. Leaders at the agency have said the FAA is committed to meeting timelines that would allow at least some companies to gain certification for their vehicles as early as 2024. Archer expects to gain

certification by the end of that year and start commercial operations afterward, Chief Executive Adam Goldstein said.

The company's technology, funding, and the regulatory framework for the industry have matured to the point that customers like United are ready to lock in orders, according to Mr. Goldstein. "There's a lot of talk about orders in the industry, a lot of talk about paper commitments, but this is the first real cash commitment," he said.

II. PCA TREFFEN 1976 to 2022. <u>Louise Swartzwalder</u>, a renowned journalist and PORSCHE enthusiast participated in the first revitalized PCA TREFFEN in 1976 and came back for a refresher in 2022 on the Spring 2022 PCA TEFFEN to Stuttgart. The December 1976 PANORAMA featured her article about the first TREFFEN to Stuttgart. Below is her article about the 2022 Spring PCA TREFFEN, which was the 60<sup>th</sup> scheduled TREFFEN since the first revitalized one in 1976! She submitted it to the PANO, but this time they rejected it. Well, here it is for your pleasure:

From the Spring PCA TREFFEN to Stuttgart May 2<sup>nd</sup> to May 7<sup>th</sup> 2022, by Louise Swartzwalder: They say your dreams show your innermost feelings. This morning, I was "back" on my "treffen" trip, laughing and driving and dining with a great bunch of Porsche lovers.

When I decided to take this trip – a redo of one I took in 1976 – I thought about all the great things I had experienced on that first adventure -- attentive compatriots, gazing at fantastic cars, being driven by a "real" race car driver. And, of course, the food and wine. This week-long trek this year took me to Stuttgart (pronounced shtuttgart) from Ohio. Along the way I thought about some of my influencers in loving vehicles. When I was a kid, I saw a toddler in neighboring Loudonville, riding a miniature car. Coincidentally, (maybe phantasmagorically) I saw a toddler named Leo driving his own version of a miniature car (a Porsche) at the Porsche museum. And I remembered how my father, John Swartzwalder (black forest) had a rule that he had to get new cars every two years.

The itinerary for our trip included a **driving training session**, for we were to drive on the Autobahn. For real. This is something most people only dream about. The Autobahn allows the driver to perform – a very good word – driving at very top speeds. We did that for two days. And our leader for this trip, our "Treffenmeister" Peter Sontag, gave us our



very own 150 mph Club's decals, patches, and pins. Sontag is the eminence at Fast Lane Travel. He organized the trip for this Porsche Club of America (PCA) group. A lot of people, when told about this trip, thought it would have been a great "vacation." I've had to inform them this was more like a little work.

To be able to drive, across incredibly beautiful terrain, require skill and devoted attention. I got help, as an adventurous driver without a companion, from diligent Miro Srebric, one of Fast Lane's European Staff, who was assigned to help me on my driving stint. Along the way on the Autobahn, we had well timed stops to use facilities. And the staff helpfully had bags of coins so we could use toilets. (Just like the old days in American when women had to use pay toilets).

After our training session, surviving the Autobahn and visiting the Mercedes Museum, we got to visit the Porsche factory. We were **the first Porsche Club** group from any country worldwide allowed in the PORSCHE Factory in two years. This, straight from Mathias Menner, the liaison with PORSCHE Club groups for Porsche. This also meant we were the first group to see the Taycan



production line in Zuffenhausen. After a fact filled Friday seeing the "real" Porsche operation, we dined well. Again. One companion, Toby Parcel, said the Friday treat at Porsche was the "most enjoyable." It was even better than being able to drive fast, she said.

The Porsche tour came in phases. We first see an older section of the factory, led by Joachim Schillmöller (call me Joe). Driverless vehicles roam the halls of this building. There are three shifts of workers. Work starts at the top of the building. Increments of work last three minutes per station. All workers are trained to do numerous jobs. The body of the vehicle is presented first. For the cockpit it takes 20 screws to put in. As the body of the vehicle descends from the top of the building to the bottom, other parts are put in. Windows get put in. The body descends, and then a "marriage" occurs. This is



when the engine is placed under the body. Doors get put back on. You get to see singular colors – Meissen blue, frozen berry metallic, star ruby. Joe says workers are kept happy – they get one month off in the summer. Plus, they receive bonuses.

At lunch at the renowned **Christophorus Restaurant**, on the top floor of the Museum, the clients' restaurant (and a Porsche namesake magazine), TREFFEN troop members smiled. "At last. It

was great," one American Porsche owner said. We visited the Porsche museum. And I snapped at the offer to sit in a Porsche police car. The Taycan visit was different. Our guide Joe was telling the truth when he warned us.

Porsche had to hire 1,500 new workers when they moved into Taycan production. The electric vehicle is CO2 neutral, meaning it conserves energy. The Taycan building has higher ceilings. One worker was happily running his forklift, smiling. We were told workers had just gotten their bonuses. It was 8,000 Euros for everyone. The body of the vehicle gets teamed with a charging box. This is the battery assembly. This unit is almost as big as the body section of the vehicle. Windows get put in. Robots (monitored) do all the work. My thought, watching all of this: I feel a little inadequate here. To do this Taycan work takes three years of apprenticeship. And 0.1 percent of the workers leave. Porsche is the number one employer in Germany, said Joe. The workers are unionized, and they go on strike "a lot."

The battery of the Taycan has <u>an eight-year warranty</u>. Huge trucks go in and out of the factory complex (.07k2) routinely. Here, the marriage of the frame and body takes 15 minutes. One tour member said "amazing -----" Last is the paint shop. There must be drying and cooling and a quality check. Paint goes on, and then metallic is applied if it is that kind of color. One vehicle was getting a mamba green metallic paint job. One of the best Porsche colors, in my opinion.

Part of our Germany trek was to visit RUF. This company is a GMBH, the same legal designation as Porsche. There you see Porsche lookalikes. But they have the RUF emblem. Rafael Riethmüller was our helper there. He showed us a room with two engine divos. These are testers for performance. Vehicles at RUF get ordered and there is a yearlong backup to get them.

As part of the trek on the Autobahn and to see RUF, we stayed at Schlossanger Alp, a pristine hotel nestled in the Bavarian Alps' foothills.

Each day's hard work got travelers to become loose. Stories were exchanged. One stalwart renamed himself Maverick, modeled on the Tom Cruise persona in action films. Treffenmeister Sontag was a true raconteur. "This a true story," he would start. Eyes rolled. But we all listened and laughed.

**Peter's Comment**: Thank you Louise for your wonderful report. We had 18 cancellations before this trip departed due to "Ukraine" and CNN's "War in Europe" reports. We didn't see a single Russian. I guarantee you that downtown New York or Chicago are far more dangerous places than Stuttgart.

## III. Update from Europe for this Fall:
