How Many Cows?

I. Delta 116 ATL to STR (Stuttgart). In 2020 when the COVID-19 Pandemic devastated the travel industry, airlines had to make decisions to survive. Delta, understandably, had to cancel certain routes. The non-stop to & from Stuttgart DL 116 & 117 was one of the victims. Thankfully, it has been reinstated. It used to fly every day in 2019, but now the schedule is a bit reduced. DL 116 eastbound ATL – STR flies on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. DL 117 westbound STR – ATL flies on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. If it's at all possible try to arrive in Stuttgart on Saturday, because that is MARKET DAY. Quick language lesson "Platz"(n) means square. The verb "platz" also used in Yiddish, means to explode as a balloon or a person full of joy overcome with happiness.
