The Twelve Alpine Passes: Today, Saturday, the lucky group, on this wonderful PORSCHE Fest, are driving on the

PORSCHE Fest, are driving on the mostly, no-speed-limit, magnificent A-7 German Autobahn to the Tirolean Alps. From there they will cross into Austria over the breathtaking Hahntennjoch Pass to the luxurious Interalpen Hotel. This is almost an understatement when you drive into the carpeted garage reception. The view south from the junior suites we have reserved for everyone is magnificent. One of THE most frequent comments we



get about this hotel is the cuisine, in that they offer the most expansive, lavish and delicious breakfast buffet, appetizer spread at dinner, and an unequalled dessert buffet with a variety, uniqueness and quantity seen nowhere else.



Then tomorrow, they'll drive west on the Austrian Autobahn and turn south through the Ötztal Valley and head on to Italy on the renowned fabulous Timmelsjoch Pass with its legendary serpentines, spectacular views and Alpine peaks.

On top of this pass is the statue of an eagle with the compelling and timely inscription: Was Freundschaft verbindet, kann Politik nich trennen. Translation: That which bonds friendship, politics cannot tear apart. It is actually a historic reference to the fact that "Süd Tirol," now is part of Northern Italy, but used to be part of the then Austro-Hungarian Empire. This territory was annexed by Italy in 1919, at the end of World War I. On April 26, 1915, Italy negotiated a secret Pact of London by which Great Britain and France promised to support Italy annexing the northern frontier lands in return for entering the war on the Entente side. To this day, many people living in South Tyrol still cannot accept the fact that they are



part of Italy. Their children learn Austrian German in addition to Italian. All public signage is in both languages. Today, about four generations later, there is this eagle statue on top of the pass proclaiming friendship.


On a personal note, in 1917, a couple months after my grandfather, Florian Schmidt married my grandmother, nee Katharina Schrittwieser, he was conscripted into the Kaiser's Military in 1917. He was stationed right here in Süd Tirol. At the end of this senseless and brutal **World War I** he returned to this little town of Mürzzuschlag, in southern Austria, to meet his baby daughter, Maria – or Mitzerl (the local endearment) who was born that December, while he was on the southern front. Mitzerl was my mother. Today, "Süd Tirol" is a beautiful, fertile, and peaceful part of the Alps known as the Dolomites. If you love driving a PORSCHE through the Alps on roads with the most awesome curves – this is in the top three.

We have also included a new resort hotel, **Chalet Mirabell**, on the south side of the Alps. The cuisine is truly delightful and paired with local wines in a beautiful setting. The cars will be parked securely under the hotel. The key element is: you don't have to think. More details continued in next week's Petergram.

a good fit for them (for whatever reason, i.e., itinerary, value, style, etc.). Obviously, it goes without saying that the cruise line will not offer or suggest a competing product even if it is better for them. "Thus, there is no objectivity when a consumer is in direct contact with a supplier. Ultimately, a good travel advisor will guide them to the cruise line or product that best fits their travel style, experience, and budget."

3. You have access to unadvertised discounts and special pricing

Because travel advisors have long-standing relationships with airlines, hotels, cruise lines, and tour companies, they can get discounts and special pricing for their clients that are not available to the general public, even online.

"Many times, people unfamiliar with using the travel agent think they will pay more when engaging a travel advisor to help them plan an adventure. In fact, travel advisors have access to unpublished rates, which help save clients money ... Many times we have exclusive benefits and perks to add - like a resort credit that would otherwise be forfeited."

4. Their first-hand experience gives you insider information

Travel advisors love to travel, giving them first-hand experiences and knowledge of destinations, airlines, hotels, and attractions around the world. It's always better to connect with someone who has been there, done that.

"I have experienced hundreds of properties globally, and can give you a first-hand account of the differentiating factors that will allow you to make a decision that gets to the right fit for you and your family, which is what it's all about," says Colleen Aaberg, co-owner, Aaberg Travel Design.


