PORSCHE Deliveries; Creating a New Trip; My Final

I. The 2023 Twelve Alpine Passes PORSCHE Fest: Continued from last week: Arriving at the Chateau Mirabelle was a delight. After a relaxing evening in Meran enjoying superb cuisine at the Chateau everyone turned in to the fresh mountain air. There is nothing like breakfast on the terrace at the Chateau with its breathtaking view of Maran.



The "12 Alpine Passes Team" checked out, Miro loaded all the large luggage into the van to make sure it's in their rooms in St. Moritz. The team then headed across the legendary 48-serpentine curves of the **Passo dello Stelvio** to posh St. Moritz, Switzerland to the

renowned 5-star **Schweizerhof Hotel** in the center of town. What a treat. Everyone had a delightful lunch at the Franzenshöhe where Karin makes THE best Kaiserschmarren in the world. You know you are in Switzerland when the décor consists of the local cows' "necklaces."



Then after crossing the **Passo di Foscagno**, **Passo di Livigno** and **Passo del Bernina** (the 8<sup>th</sup> one – 4
more to go), the team arrived safely in
St. Moritz at the elegant 5-star
Schweizerhof Hotel. On **Tuesday**, the
team left St. Moritz and was heading to
Lake Lucerne. Today's Passes
included the **Julier** and **Oberalb Passes**. Of course, on the way lunch
was served at our favorite stop, the **Berggasthaus Piz Calmot**, adjacent to
a magnificent glacier Stausee a 6,000'
high mountain water reservoir lake,
which is the source of the Rhine River



on the border of the Swiss Cantons (states) of Uri and Graubünden.

The team then arrived on the shores of **Lake Lucerne** at the lakeside **Seehotel Sternen**. This hotel is conveniently located only 10 minutes from Lucerne itself. Dinner tonight was served at a nearby **Ristorante La Fontana**, an exquisite Mediterranean Restaurant. Why not at the hotel's superb restaurant, you ask? Because Tuesday is Ruhetag! Apparently



after a busy weekend the kitchen staff get Monday and Tuesday off. Welcome to Swiss hotel unions.

On **Thursday**, the team headed north from Switzerland to the **Black Forest**. It's about a 430 kms drive, so rather than doing a lunch stop at a restaurant on the way back to Stuttgart Fabian had the **Seehotel Sternen** pack a Swiss lunch box for everyone. ### IV. Some of Pictures Showing us at Work and Play.
