I. Now Floating on the Garonne:

Wednesday, July 19th, 2023:

I went to the office this morning to wrap up a couple of open Euro Delivery planning items. Also, we are getting more inquiries about custom family trips. Likewise, the European Delivery Program is ramping up. There is always the "Epcot" syndrome we must deal with. "Peter, I'm in Europe on business and I want to tack on a long weekend. I want to see the Normandy Beaches; visit the PORSCHE Factory in Stuttgart, my wife wants to see David in Florence and do a little shopping in Milan, and we hear Vienna is the most beautiful city in Europe for sightseeing?" One of our key specialties is that we try to incorporate as many of the brand name destinations that customers have read about, or which have been mentioned by friends. A customer today thanked me profusely for sharing our knowledge and advice with him. We laid out a wonderful trip. Now the hard part starts - making reservations in 5 countries during peak season. And, no, you can't do that online. We must call our key contacts, make a deposit or pre-pay the whole stay, and

lock in the space. **Back to the Bordeaux River Cruise**: Christina ran me to the TPA
Airport, and I flew TPA – JFK – CDG – BOD.
Departed JFK punctually at 20:30 and arrived at CDG 20 minutes early – the gate was occupied so we waited on the tarmac.

Thursday, July 20th, 2023:

Finally, after about a half an hour the plane was able. At Paris' CDG Susan Sheridan – our wonderful travel agency manager – had organized a VIP Transfer Service for my arrival – I wanted to see how the service worked. What we can do for customers in some European cities is to provide such a



service where you are met at the top of the jetway as you get off the plane. That service is very useful, especially at huge European airports where you don't speak the language. It is a bit pricey at about \$240 to \$300 per arrival, however if you have a tight connection in Europe or are worried about this is the way to go. There is nothing like a friendly face on top of the jetway.

Unfortunately, our connecting flight to Bordeaux did not leave until 16:30 so after a transatlantic flight, a layover of six hours plus was not pleasant; however, our guide took us to a lounge which was about 5 minutes walking from our gate to Bordeaux. In the lounge we had refreshments and coffee lots of coffee. He then returned at 15:45 and escorted us to the Bordeaux gate. No problem. I had purchased Air Tags for everyone and was reassured that all my luggage was on board the AB 321 CDG to BOD. In less than an hour, after a beautiful flight over the French countryside, we landed in Bordeaux. Here is some advice: if you ever go on an AMA cruise from Bordeaux. Go to the bathroom after you get off the plane, because once you are at the luggage belt, there are no bathrooms until after you collect your luggage and are out of the customs area.

We were met at the airport by representatives of AMA waterways, the luggage was loaded efficiently on the bus, and 15 minutes later we were at the river looking at this magnificent river ship on the Garonne River. Check in was smooth and a gin & tonic helped overcome the arduous flight and layover.

Thursday, July 21st, 2023:

Today the AMA Dolce headed from Bordeaux to Saint-Emilion. I was awakened by some thumping overhead. My stateroom #305 apparently was right under the jogging track. No problem, it was good to know that some folks were up early exercising. It was a smooth trip to Saint-Emilion. Lots of wine tasting. I'm too incoherent to keep writing. 






II. Christmas trip
