

It is a very gratifying experience picking up your brand-new Porsche in Stuttgart or Leipzig and driving it in Europe the way it was meant to be driven. On most of our European Porsche Tours we have at least one or two European Delivery Porsches.



Well over 95% of the new car buyers have never driven in Europe. Thus, the advantage of being part of one of our tours is that they get a driver's briefing, they are able to follow a guide connected with a walkie talkie, they don't need to speak the language, and most importantly, secure overnight parking is reserved at each hotel. I am currently on my 226th Porsche Tour - when you pick up a new car, please don't go at it alone!

II. A 2023 CUSTOM Tour to Vienna, Austria:

• Saturday, September 30th 2023 continued: I was promptly picked up at 12:30 pm at the Graf Zeppelin Hotel in Stuttgart and transferred to STR – Stuttgart's Degerloch International Airport. Austrian Airlines Flight OS 184 departed promptly at 15:15 (3:15 pm) and landed an hour later in VIE – Vienna. We had a beautiful view of Salzburg and the Steiermark Mountains on the way down. The area around the Vienna Airport is populated by a forest of wind turbines giving the landscape a futuristic appearance. I was met by Lukas Pfisterer, Hans' son and driver, in their new Tesla, to the Hotel Sacher adjacent to the renowned Vienna State Opera. I immediately set up my "office" and started to work. In the old days, when checking into a hotel, one first unpacked, perhaps went to the bathroom etc. these days, the first order of the day is: Internet access. Hans Pfisterer, our local business partner, then met me for dinner at the Sacher Bistro, sitting outside, enjoying the balmy fall evening.

The **Sacher Hotel** in Vienna has a fascinating history: in 1832 Prince von Metternich instructed the merely 16-year-old apprentice Franz Sacher to create a special dessert for his discerning guests. The sweet and sumptuous masterpiece was to be made with chocolate, apricot jam, and whipped cream, which became the tasty triad comprising the basis of the recipe for success that would become the Original Sacher-Torte. That very recipe remains the foundation for every Original Sacher-Torte baked by hand to this very day. Today, the Original Sacher-Torte stands out as one of Vienna's



cultural and culinary crowning symbols. Indeed, the hotel, which the son of the pioneering pâtissier opened years later, now similarly stands out as one of the most renowned hotels in the world! It is also the hotel where **Dave Hatch** invited my daughter Alicia and me, along with another dozen friends, in February 2009 to the legendary **Vienna Opera Ball**. The evening before we met Dr. **Wolfgang Porsche** at the Rote Bar. After meeting Dave, he said to him "Er ist ein kluger Mann!" It truly was an

amazing, once in a lifetime, event. Thank you, Dave, for your generosity and the wonderful memories.

Sunday, October 1st 2023:



While having breakfast at the Sacher I picked up the local newspaper: Die Kronen Zeitung ... what do you know ... there was an article about several small, charming Austrian towns, including **Gmünd** in the Austrian State of Kärnten (Carinthia in English). I don't know why there is a balloon floating in the middle of the picture. It describes the great little shops; highlights the Porsche Museum, local culture and reminds the readers that the first Porsches were built there from 1944 to 1950. Of course, like some in the US, their facts are inaccurate. This is a little more accurate: Produced between 1948 and 1951, the Porsche 356 was the first series production aluminum bodied sports car of

Porsche, after the creation of the 356-001 one-off prototype in Gmund Austria. It was built in limited numbers, making it a highly sought-after collector's item today. Source: Wikipedia

COMMENT ON THE INTERALPEN TRIP ... DON'T FORGET ... On October 11th 2023 – our FREE day on the Interalpen Porsche Fest, I have offered an optional day trip to Gmünd. It'll be a pretty long day, but worthwhile, driving across the daunting Grossglockner Mountain Pass, the highest Alpine Road in Austria at 2,504 meters (8,215 ft.) surrounded by 12,500 ft. high peaks. We'll visit the compelling Pfeifhofer Porsche Museum, have lunch at the renowned Fallerhütte Restaurant in the Malta Valley and get a chance to visit the closed-to-the-public original Porsche Factory HQ. You'll be able to see Ferdinand Porsche's original drafting table, desk, and the original plans of the legendary Cisitalia Porsche Race Car.

- Monday, October 2nd 2023 Back to our Vienna Custom Trip for Mark and Eileen Fischer. Today was a busy day getting ready for Mark and Eileen Fischer's arrival. Hans, our local executive, has arranged a Rolls Royce Phantom for the airport pick up and to be at our disposal for the balance of the week. I am flying back to Stuttgart on Thursday to conduct the Fast Lane Drivers' Briefing for the Interalpen Porsche Fest group arriving that morning at the Hotel Graf Zeppelin. Since it's Mark and Eileen's 10th Fast Lane Porsche trip, Mark and Eileen could conduct the briefing in their sleep, so they are heading back to Stuttgart on Thursday.
- **Tuesday, October 3rd 2023** We are exploring Vienna today and are visiting venues normal tourists don't get to see. We started out at the Naschmarkt, which is a permanent outdoor market with an amazing variety



of fresh fruits and vegetables, meats, seafood, and condiments from all over the world. It is more amazing than Whole Foods. From there we were driven to the Zentralfriedhof, Vienna's main cemetery. We first visited the musicians' section where we visited Beethoven. Brahms. Schubert, Mahler, Dumas, Gluck, Salieri and a memorial to Mozart. In April 1945 the area of the cemetery saw fierce fighting between the Russians invading Austria from the east and the conscripted Austrians and Hitler's German Wehrmacht. We visited the compelling Russian Cemetery with the graves of hundreds of Russian soldiers who died

there. Lastly, we visited my mom's grave. It touched my heart when Eileen picked some wildflowers and placed them on her grave. Thank you Mark and Eileen. We then took the scenic route back into town, past the Riesenrad and Prater amusement park. The day was crowned by a fabulous dinner on the roof terrace of the renowned DO & CO Restaurant right across St. Stephen's Cathedral. We returned to the Sacher Hotel in a horse-drawn carriage, a Fiaker. What a wonderful way to experience Vienna.



• Wednesday, October 4th 2023 A perfect sunny day to take them to a privately owned castle outside of Vienna on the North Shore of the Danube. Castle Kreuzenstein is a majestic medieval castle, with a moat, 2 draw bridges, a very pointed fall gate and an amazing collection of medieval armaments. This 12th Century fortress has an amazing history of wars and destruction over the last 1000 years or so. In the 18th century, the castle came into the possession of the Counts of Wilczek who had amassed a large fortune through their coal mines in Silesia. In 1874, Count Johann Nepomuk Wilczek, best known as a polar explorer, began reconstruction of the castle but in a style entirely different

from the original Romanesque-Gothic architecture. The existing ruins were incorporated into the new castle, in particular, parts of the outer wall, the east tower and parts of the chapel. Source: Wikipedia

We enjoyed a tour of the entire fortress, including the amazing underground kitchen with a 30' long kitchen table hewn from a tree trunk which is so large that the castle was built around it. One of the most fascinating places in the castle is the armory with its vast collection of medieval armor and weapons.

We then returned to the city for one of Austria's most pleasurable experiences . . . an Austrian pedicure. Pedicurist professionals have to work as an apprentice for 3 years, attend vocational schools and practically get a medical degree. I haven't danced in a while, but I guarantee you that you feel like dancing afterwards.

A beautiful day was crowned by a magnificent dinner in the private home of one of our executives in Austria, Hans & Gitti and their kids: Denise, Sophie, Lukas and Taifun (Sophie's boyfriend). It was a fabulous European table setting. The champagne and red wine flowed freely complementing an appetizer spinach strudel. It was followed by THE very best Wiener Schnitzel ever. By the way: Schnitzel by itself is not a dish, but the way the meat is cut. If you take a chateaubriand and cut it vertically you create a

series of Filet Mignons. If you cut it perpendicularly, the cut is called a Schnitzel Cut. It was a truly memorable evening and what a pleasant change from eating at a restaurant every night.

• Thursday, October 4th 2023 This morning I had to get up at an ungodly hour of 5:00 am to catch my flight to Stuttgart. I arrived at the Graf



Zeppelin Hotel to be greeted by some of the folks who arrived already. We started the trip with a delicious lunch of the famous local specialty, the Maultaschen. We then went to a private conference room where I conducted our mandatory Drivers' Briefing about how to drive safely in Europe, and explain the very different rules of the road and demonstrated the use

of our longer-range walkie talkies. We also had everyone sign the PCA, Porsche and Fast Lane Releases. After some shopping we either dressed casually or donned our Lederhosen and Dirndls.
