My Dear Fast Lane Family, Friends and Supporters!



- IV. **2024 Update:** After ringing in the New Year, our sincere objective is to attract budget minded PCA members. We created a mini PCA Treffen, which basically allows PCA members with limited time or a smaller budget to see the holy grail, i.e., the PORSCHE FACTORY and MUSEUM in Stuttgart. The original "Traditional" Spring PCA Treffen registrations are still open. We did offer an early registration bonus of \$500 per person, if you signed up by Christmas. I am extending that offer until January 31st, 2024, and will also promote it at the St. Petersburg "Festival of Speed" on January 21st, 2024. The PCA Spring Treffen Plus takes us into the Black Forest and a day trip to France to the renowned Bugatti Museum.
- V. Then, we'll have a small group of race enthusiasts coming to the 101st running of Le Mans. The toughest part about Le Mans is to manage the expectations of the participants. For example, last year, at the 100th Le Mans Race, we purchased, at over 1,000 Euros each, "exclusive" VIP Grid Walk Tickets, so that before and after the race our customers could walk on the track, meet drivers, see the cars up close and take tons of pictures. However, at the end of the race, the **ACO** (The French **A**utomobile **C**lub del **O**uest the race sponsor), to the dismay of all VIP guests, opened the gates and removed all barricades to all spectators, thus creating a flood of about a hundred

So, we created, at considerable expense, the **Seven Country Driving Adventure:** Germany, Luxembourg, France, Italy, Austria, Liechtenstein and Switzerland. GOOD NEWS: We've had a good response to the **Twelve Alpine Passes!** Both **50**th **Anniversary Trips** in September will be amazing and, based on current registrations, will definitely be successful. The PCA Fall Treffen trips have a much stronger response than the Spring - same thing every year. Tuscany will be sold out, as every year – because it's THE best Tuscany experience money can buy.
