## I. Two of our many favorite Restaurants in Southern Germany contributed by Catherine Moore, our dedicated staff itinerary creator.

As noted in my previous Petergrams, Fast Lane Travel only selects hotels where we know there is ample, secure parking and, of course, delightful ambience. These considerations are also our requirements for selecting our restaurants. Here are two examples of our careful quality selection. Both places you'd never find on your own – and that's what makes our trips special.

Our tours generally begin and end in Stuttgart. We always include dinner at the delightful **Stuttgarter Stäffele**. This traditional local cuisine

restaurant in the heart of Stuttgart is over 50 years old and committed to providing regional, quality cuisine using farm-fresh ingredients verified as from the State of Baden-Württemberg. As part of the "Taste of the South" restauranteurs, their menu offers all sorts of



local specialties and a huge selection of regional wines. One of the menu offerings we always suggest is the **onion soup**. Not only is it delicious, but it is also served in a large onion! The restaurant was originally called Hobby Club and was home to the Motor-Club Stuttgart. When the Club built a new venue, the owner, the late Erika Wilhelmer, turned the building back into a wine cellar as it had been in the past. Her son Michael was just elected as the Gastronome of the year in Stuttgart. In the old days, food like this was generally only cooked in homes, but she persisted. Thankfully, her idea of Schwäbische cuisine caught the attention of friends and customers and the restaurant flourished. We love this restaurant. The interior not only oozes Schwäbische atmosphere, which is the perfect setting for its delicious local cuisine!

**Definition:** What is Schwäbisch? In the 10<sup>th</sup> Century, Germany was made up of five duchies: Bavaria, Franconia, Lorraine, Saxony, and Swabia = in Germany Schwaben. This duchy was located in southwestern Germany; like all others had a distinct local German dialect was known for its hardworking industrious citizens. For example, a polite greeting in German is: "Guten Morgen." Except in Swabia it's "Gut Schaffe!" Meaning "Have a good workday." I suppose that says it all

Our second secret gem is the **Schlossanger Alp**. It is not only a lovely restaurant but also part of a wellness hotel located in the middle of the Allgäu Alpine meadows and surrounded by mountains high up in Bavaria. The restaurant is consistently rated as one of the top 100 restaurants in Germany. The restaurant offers "the no-frills way of getting to the heart of



taste" by not overwhelming you with too many components. Their menu changes with the seasons, offering the freshest ingredients from local farms and the surrounding area. The alpine ambiance of the restaurant adds to the enjoyment of the cuisine with its homey, cozy atmosphere. Windows offer magnificent views of the Allgäu meadows and mountains, including a view of the Falkenstein castle ruins which are illuminated at night. If the weather permits, dining on the sun terrace is always a delight. You might even hear cow bells from the cows grazing nearby or catch a glimpse of a chamois on the edge of a mountain cliff. It's a lovely location and the food is fantastic.

And it also falls into the category of "there is no way you'd ever find this place on your own." We also have stayed there occasionally for one night. The fresh mountain air is invigorating. In the morning the melancholic bells of the cows grazing will wake you along with the fresh brewed coffee.


