I. Is the Black Forest Really Black?

If you have two or three days before or after the delivery of your new PORSCHE or before or after one of our tours, a fabulous destination for a

short adventure from Stuttgart is the **Black Forest**.

One of the most beautiful and legendary areas of Germany – the **Black Forest**, or *Schwarzwald* as it's known in German, isn't really black, but more of a deep dark green. The vegetation is so dense that even on a sunny day, little daylight penetrates this solid canopy of tall trees. Since the densely growing spruces look very dark and impregnatable from a distance, two thousand years ago the Romans named the area "silva nigra" (which means **Black Forest**).



With deeply carved valleys, thick woodlands, luscious meadows, timber-framed farmhouses and cascading waterfalls, the **Black Forest** is just waiting to be explored, experienced and photographed.

The Autobahn A-81 is THE best way to get to the Black Forest from Stuttgart. And, yes, this lady is doing 250 kms/hr = 155 mph. As my friend, Eric Polins, once said while he was driving on the Autobahn "this is so right!" Yes it is, and it is a lot safer than doing 70 mph on the I-95.



Driving to and within the **Black Forest** is magnificent! Leaving Stuttgart, you'll travel southwest on the fabulous Autobahns A-81 before discovering the breathtaking and winding roads of the **Black Forest**, including the well-known **Black Forest High Road** (*Schwarzwaldhochstrasse*). Thanks to this and other country roads, you will not only enjoy thrilling drives but also see the picturesque villages, serene farms, forests, meadows and vineyards of the **Black Forest**. Here's the best part: cuckoo clocks!

You must stop in **Triberg** to see displays of the **Black Forest's famous cuckoo clocks** – **THE best place**, with **plenty of parking**, is **The House of 1000 Clocks, Am Bach 17, 78098 Triberg im Schwarzwald, Germany**. Say hello to Rebecca Weisser, a lovely lady from Kansas who married our good friend Thomas Weisser, the owner of the store.

Then, perhaps, stop at scenic **Lake Titisee**. Buy some souvenirs and walk around the small lake. It's beautiful. There are two wonderful hotels we recommend for your overnight stays, the 5-star *Parkhotel Adler* surrounded by parkland in Hinterzarten, and the 5-star *Brenners Park-Hotel & Spa* in Baden-Baden, known for its "Old World" elegance, hot springs and casino.



As you begin your return drive to Stuttgart via winding country roads, you may want to stop at **Castle Bühlerhöhe**. Situated above the **Rhine valley**, you can enjoy a picturesque lunch there on the castle terrace. Following lunch, depart for an exciting drive back to Stuttgart on several backroads and on some of the least crowded Autobahns in Germany. We think the beauty of the area, the thrill of driving the Autobahns and the winding roads throughout the **Black Forest** will give you and your PORSCHE fond memories.
