Friday, June 7th

The Buena Vista Tour Group (BVTG) arrived in Stuttgart and were transferred to our hotel, the lovely Le Meridien Stuttgart – I greeted them in the lobby as they arrived.

After checking in and refreshing, we went to dinner at Restaurant CUBE, a delightful restaurant with glass walls overlooking the Schlossplatz and park. We had a great dinner at CUBE and after dinner we decided to walk back to the Le Meridien – everyone enjoyed that. The ladies had on sneakers so walking was not a problem!

Saturday, June 8th

The breakfast buffet at the Le Meridien has a fantastic selection of food to choose from and outstanding service. Our motorcoach arrived on time and

we were transferred to Porscheplatz. The group enjoyed a tour (in English) of the Porsche Museum before dining on an elegant lunch at Restaurant Christophorus in the Museum.

Following lunch, we went to the "Porsche Drive" counter to complete the rental of our Porsches. We then had the walkie-talkie instruction, checked out the cars, and drove back to the Le Meridien.



In the evening, a motorcoach transferred us to Restaurant Plenum where we enjoyed another excellent dinner and, again, decided to walk back to the Le Meridien—a great day.

Sunday, June 9th

The breakfast buffet at the Le Meridien, once again, was excellent. Everyone checked out, luggage was loaded into our luggage van, and we departed.

We first drove through the tunnel towards Esslingen, then along the Neckar River and to the A-8. We made our first pit stop at the Gruibingen Rest Stop. Everyone became familiar with the coin-operated WC turnstiles! We continued on the A-8 to the A-7 and south to have lunch at the scenic Hotel

Schlossanger Alp. Lunch was superb, as always, and we continued our drive to our afternoon traditional pit-stop in Bschlabs: Gasthof zur Gemütlichkeit. I called ahead and they had Apfelstrudel, Espressos, and Cappuccinos ready for us.

After the break, we headed to the Hahntennjoch alpine pass only to be greeted by Mother Nature's first "gotcha" -- a red light and a "gesperrt" sign. This winter the Hahntennjoch had the heaviest snowfall ever with seven meters of snow - about 21 ft.! This weakened the hillsides. Apparently, there was heavy rain last night and several rockslides thundered down, blocking part of the road. Thus, we had to turn around and go back down to Reutte and turn south to the Fernpass. We crossed over the Bavarian Alps to Imst, Austria. We made a quick pit stop at the Zugspitzblick Rest Stop just before the zenith of the pass. We then got onto the Austrian Autobahn – a rather slow 130 km/h speed limit. We got off at Telfs Ost and headed up to the spectacular Hotel Interalpen Tirol.



As always, the service at the hotel was superb. Even the Porsches were pampered in the hotel's exquisite garage! Everyone's luggage was in their room. Given the delay, I had called the hotel and moved dinner to 7:30. A delicious dinner at a beautifully set table adjacent to the Wintergarten was enjoyed by all. Everyone was in awe of the alpine views from their rooms.



Monday, June 10th

There is no other breakfast buffet in the world like the one at the Hotel Interalpen Tirol! Today we had planned a drive over the Timmelsjoch pass to St. Leonard in the Passeier Valley, Italy to our favorite Restaurant and Pizzeria "Der Brückenwirt" along the Königsseeache River. Once again, Mother Nature forced a change in our plans. The ominous Timmelsjoch pass was closed due to late-season avalanches.

The BVTG made the decision to take a day trip to Salzburg instead. I got onto the arrangements immediately and I was able to get reserved parking for the Porsches at the Sheraton Salzburg and, with a private guide, the group experienced charming Salzburg via horse-drawn carriages. The carriages let the group off at the Mozart Platz. They "did" all the sights, including the Getreidegasse (pedestrian-only shopping area), and had a hot lunch at the Sternbräu in Salzburg. The BVTG then walked across the bridge back to the Sheraton, got in their Porsches, and drove back to the Hotel Interalpen. When the group returned to the Hotel Interalpen, they had time for a quick refresh before enjoying a late dinner. Everybody was very happy with Salzburg.



Tuesday. June 11th

Another great breakfast buffet at the Hotel Interalpen greeted the new day. Today we had planned to drive the Timmelsjoch pass, however, Mother Nature again had a different idea. Several avalanches and golf ball size hail eliminated that option. After canceling the pit stop in Sölden and the lunch at Brückenwirt in St. Leonard, we made the decision to take the Achenseebahn steam train up to Seespitz and the boat to Pertisau today.

My good friend Joschi Entner called the train company, but everything was sold out. There was not a seat to be had. I then called the Strandhotel Entner to reserve lunch and decided that we would drive up to Pertisau. It is a short curvy road up the mountain. We first drove around Pertisau to give the group an idea of the area and then went to our reserved luncheon. At Strandhotel Entner, everything was ready for us with a beautifully set table. After lunch everyone had a little time to do some souvenir shopping in this cute town. I then decided rather than take the Austrian Autobahn back we would drive around the lake and take a "secret" private toll road, north of the Achensee to the Faller Klamm Brücke and Mittenwald and back

to the Hotel Interalpen. Another delicious dinner at the hotel crowned our fun, if unplanned day.

Wednesday, June 12th

Today our plan was to head to Lindau via the Silvretta Hochalpenstrasse – no problem. Mother Nature decided to give us a break! However, the BVTG wanted to see Neuschwanstein Castle. So, I canceled our luncheon at the Hotel Schönblick in Vorarlberg. After checking out, we headed to Imst on the Austrian Autobahn and then across the Hahntennjoch pass from south to north. Today the pass was open! We stopped on top and took pictures. The drive was spectacular, and the comment was: "I have never seen anything like this in my life!" Once again, we stopped in Bschlabs, had Espressos & Cappuccinos. I also called the Hotel Sommer in Füssen to have a table set for us for lunch. They did a superb job. After lunch we headed up the A-96 for a few "no-speed limit kilometers" and then west towards Lindau on the B-12.



The Bayerischer Hof was ready for us. We had cocktails on the terrace and an a la carte dinner on the terrace next door at Reutemann's. There was a debate as to what to do tomorrow and the decision was to just have a relaxing day and explore Lindau.
