<u>Subjects</u>: Hans-Peter PORSCHE Traumwerk; Sound-of-Music Salzburg; Vienna; La Traviata; Mürzzuschlag; Zell am See; Gerlos Pass; Hotel Interalpen; 2025 Dates; My Final Thoughts: The Physical

I. Wednesday, September 4th **2024:** our drive guide team had the Porsches lined up in the courtyard behind the hotel in two driving groups, with everyone's names properly displayed on their dashboards. The hotel staff blocked the traffic so we could all get out and head up the B27 towards Stuttgart's Airport and the Autobahn A-8. "Getting out of Dodge" the first day is always a challenge because of traffic lights and morning commuter traffic. We made it smoothly onto the A-8 on this my 238th PORSCHE Tour. Shortly after the STR Airport we could open it up on the first no-speed-limit section of the German Autobahn.



About 25 minutes out of town we made our first pit stop, stretched our legs, and resolved any questions about the new Porsches. In Germany the guides refer to it as a Technical Stop. I'll have to tell you a funny story about that term next time we see each other. We then continued up the Aichelberg to the Allgäuer High Plateau. Once again, wide open Autobahn – no speed limit – direction München. We circumnavigated Munich on the north side and whooshed through the Hofoldinger Forst towards Salzburg.

A half hour before Salzburg is this wonderful new **MUST-SEE** attraction: the **Hans-Peter PORSCHE Traumwerk**. It's a museum, historic venue and wonderful restaurant. It's only 5 minutes off the A-8 and fantastic.





Parking, of course, was reserved for us.





After a delicious lunch of currywurst or superb salad with fried chicken breast with nice cold Almdudler (no alcohol at lunch). We arrived at the Salzburg Sheraton about 20 minutes after lunch. Check-in was smooth and everyone was thrilled with their accommodations. Tonight, we enjoyed a Mozart Dinner Concert at the St. Peterskeller. Europe's oldest restaurant was



founded in 804 . . . yes founded 1,220 years ago. No worries, they did update the kitchen and the restrooms. The building was a former baroque monastery with wonderful acoustics.





II. Thursday, September 5th 2024: Today's destination was Gmünd, the site of the original post-WW II PORSCHE Factory and the wonderful Pfeifhofer PORSCHE Museum. We crossed over the highest Alpine Mountain Road: the ominous **Grossglockner**. Everyone was grateful for the Fast Lane Travel vests they got the night before as their good night present with our traditional goodnight note announcing tomorrow's activities.



The only private Porsche Museum is in Gmünd in Carinthia, Austria, where the first vehicles bearing the Porsche name were built between 1944 and 1950. The extensive collection includes the Porsche 356 Type 356 020 ALU, the buoyant Porsche hunting car (1956) and Porsche rally and racing cars. Another highlight is Austria's first and only police Porsche 911. A special exhibition changes every year. This year: "60 years of the Porsche 911". A multimedia presentation on the history and designs of Porsche provides further informative information. Of course, we also arranged a "closed to the public" visit of the original first PORSCHE Factory. What a treat to sit at Ferdinand Porsche's desk and touch his drafting table. The original blueprint of the Cisitalia and the list of the first 20 PORSCHE 356 customers are also on display. Does the name Ruprecht von Senger sound familiar?

III. Friday, September 6th 2024: Today Vienna was on the agenda. The Porsches were lined up eagerly ready to go.



We left Salzburg through easy morning traffic and headed on the Austrian Autobahn A-1 to Mondsee's rest stop. We gassed up all the cars in our normal F-1 procedure. Since you can't pay at the pump in Austria, Germany, Italy etc. we have developed our highly efficient system of gassing the cars with minimum time wasted.





















We had a smooth and quick trip to Vienna. Everyone was looking forward to the renowned 5-Star Sacher Hotel right behind the Opera House and on the corner of Kärtnerstrasse – Vienna's elegant shopping street. However, like most cities in Europe parking in Vienna is challenging. Thus, we arranged parking outside of Vienna at one of my dear friend's bus company great headquarters. They were ready for us and all Porsches were safely parked inside a cavernous bus garage. In the meanwhile, our luggage has already arrived with our luggage van and was waiting in the customers' respective rooms at the Sacher.

Check-in was efficient and everyone was very pleased with their junior suites or rooms. We had an early dinner at the Sacher because we were slated to enjoy a performance of Giuseppe Verdi's La Traviata. After dinner we strolled across to the Vienna State Opera. Our man in Vienna, Hans was able to get spectacular seats, albeit at a hefty 140% premium. Bob answered impatiently, "If I told you once, Irma, I told you a hundred times ... what we have is Blue Cross!"


