


<u>Subjects</u>: Euro Delivery Answers; Come with us to Dubai – it's Awesome; My FINAL THOUGHTS: Are you over 60?

- I. 12 Very important answers to essential key questions, when we are planning a European Delivery or a Custom Tour for you, to assure your safety, enhance your enjoyment and match your budget:
 - 1. Where are you picking up your car: Leipzig? Stuttgart? Other Location? We've had customers pick up cars in Austria or France, for example.
 - 2. What is your scheduled delivery date? That is essential in matching your travel schedule. We have very few cases where your car was not ready on the delivery date. In those rare cases Porsche, in the past, has provided a rental at no cost to you.
 - 3. How long are you planning on staying? Good Question.
 - 4. Have you made your travel arrangements? We prefer making your travel arrangements in case of necessity changes.

- 5. Have you driven in Europe before? If no, we will provide you with our publication "Driving in Europe is Different!" and, when practical do a power-point driver's briefing for you before you depart.
- 6. If yes, where, and:
 - A. What was the most enjoyable aspect?
 - B. What would you do differently? Good Questions.
- 7. Are you traveling solo or with another person(s)? Important for accommodations and "pit stops." The chairman of a Silicon Valley company told me: "the reason we love the Fast Lane trips is that you tell me when to pee."
- 8. When does your passport expire (is it a US or Canadian passport)? You must have at least 6 months before your return date a year is better.
- 9. Do you have an International Driver's License? They are very easy to obtain at your local AAA Office.
- 10. Do you speak another language, in addition to English? Helpful, but not necessary pretty much everybody speaks English.
- 11. Do you have specific regions, cities, highlights or
 - experiences you want to include?
 For example, we've had two
 musician brothers who wanted to
 follow in the footsteps of Johannes
 Brahms and visit the Bösendorfer
 Factory (they didn't offer tours, but
 we got them in). Or people wanted
 to explore their ancestral regions.
- 12. Do you have any dietary or medical concerns? Allergies? Some folks also have had breathing problems, so mountain passes over 6,000 ft. had to be avoided.

- We want to see the beaches in Normandy; my wife wants to do some shopping in Milan, and we want to have some Wiener Schnitzel in Vienna. Oh, we only have 3 days in Europe. <u>Fast</u> <u>Lane:</u> Sorry, it is not EPCOT!
- We want to drive the Autobahn from Stuttgart to the Riviera with no speed limit. Fast Lane: Only Germany has sections of the Autobahn with no speed limit. The rest of Europe is 130 kms/hr ~80 m/hr. Other countries also have Autobahn, Autostrada or Autoroute toll requirements! Don't forget there is also traffic we cannot control but, based on experience, we do know that the A-81 on a Tuesday afternoon between Heilbronn and Würzburg has less traffic than the A-8 between Stuttgart and Ulm.
- I'm getting delivery in December in Stuttgart and I am driving to Zürich, do I need snow tires? <u>Fast Lane</u>: Yes, they will provde them to you. After your trip you can return to Stuttgart and they replace the snow tires with all-year tires before shipping your car back.
- Do they use the same gas in Monte Carlo? Fast Lane: Yes but only use premium please, and the Octane goes up to 130 at some stations, spoiling you and your car.
- We only want to stay in little B & B's in little villages. <u>Fast Lane:</u>
 DON'T! We recommend 5-star hotels with <u>secure parking</u>. You don't want to leave a quarter- million Dollar piece of equipment sitting all night on the street?
